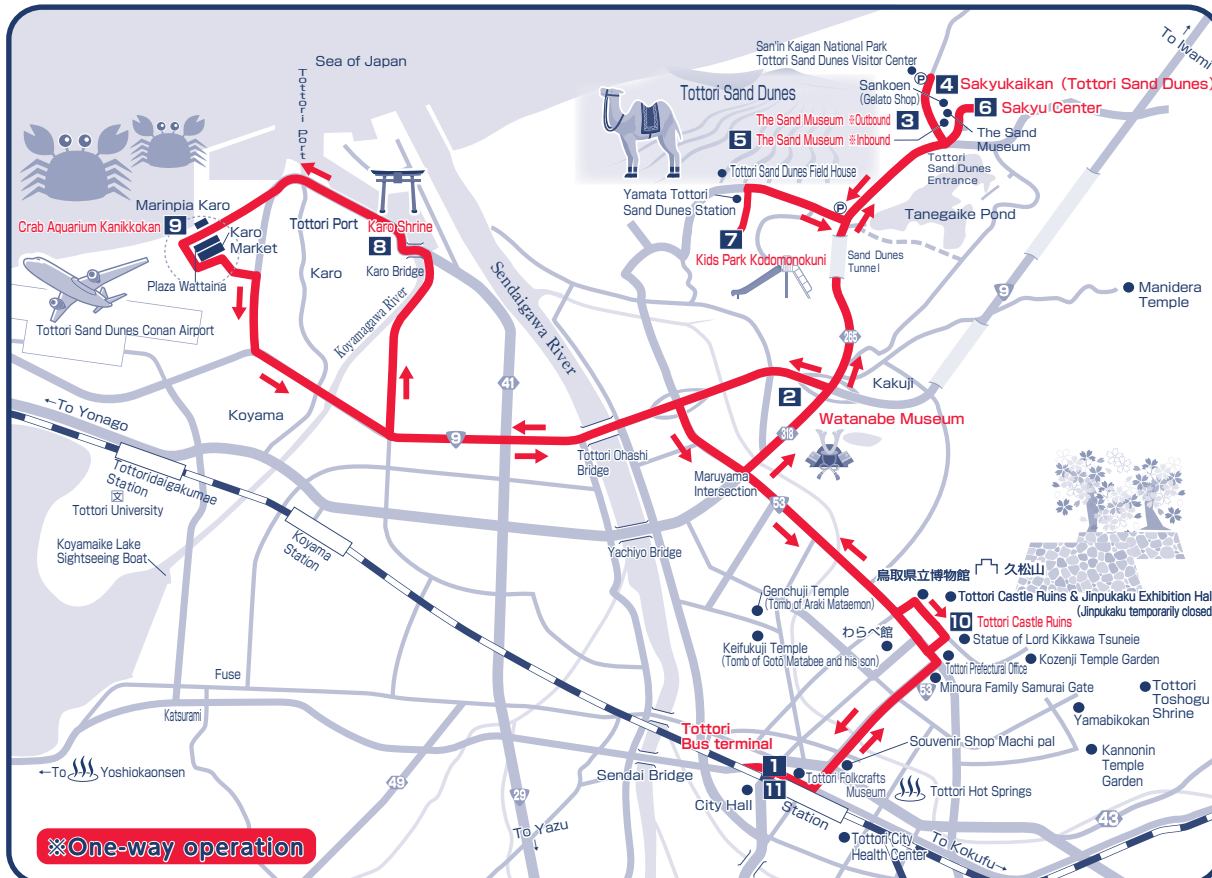

2 Watanabe Art Museum

The museums collection of approximately 30,000 antique pieces, including a nationally renowned collection of armor and swords. There is so much to see such as one of the oldest folding screens of the Soga story and the restored sword "Urashima Kotetsu" passed down by the Tottori Ikeda clan.



8 Karo Shrine

The port village of Karo, home to this shrine, holds the designation of a "Kitamae bune", a Japan heritage site. Notably, the shrine features one-of-a-kind tiger-shaped komainu (guardian dogs).



3 Tottori Sand Dunes, The Sand Museum

The worlds first sand sculpture museum. It offers the best quality sculptures with a different theme every year. A workshop is regularly available offering activities such as a mini sand sculpture experience.



9 Tottori Karo Kanikko kan

Get up close to a variety of sea creatures, with a primary focus on crabs (Admission free)

4 Tottori Sand Dunes

The Tottori Sand Dunes stretches 16km east-west and 2.4km north-south. This "sand hill" formed by the Sendai River and winds for 100,000 years will leave you speechless. More than 1 million visitors every year.



10 Tottori Castle Ruins • Kyusho Park

Tottori Castle, the site of Toyotomi Hideyoshi's infamous starvation siege. It is a 10-minute walk from the park that was developed on the site to Ninomaru, where you can get a panoramic view of the city. In spring, it is famous for cherry blossoms, followed by the azaleas in full bloom at Kyusho Park.



7 Tottori Sand Dunes, Kodomo no Kuni

Children can enjoy outdoor play equipment in the Sand Dunes. Workshops are offered using wood and sand. A water play ground is available in summer. Different activities and events on weekends and holidays.



What is Kirin-jishi Lion Dance?

In eastern Tottori Prefecture (Inaba) and northern western Hyogo Prefecture (Tajima), Kirin-jishi lion dances are dedicated to shrines, with people wearing lion heads modeled after kirin, a mythical Chinese animal.
